The bill for the redemption of the trade dollar passed by the Senate recently provides that until July 1, 1887, trade dollars shall be exchanged for standard silver dollars at the Treasury and sub-treasuries and that the trade dollar shall be used at the mints as silver bullion for coinage and shall be deducted from the amount of silver bullion to be monthly coined provided that the sum of trade dollars redeemed does not exceed 500,000 per month.

At last the Ohio high liquor-tax law has been pronounced constitutional by the Supreme Court. The law is substantially a high license measure with provision for local option. Over one hundred towns and villages have prohibition under it now, while the tax in the rest brings in about \$3,000,000 into the treasury. The decision of the court is a great victory for the Republicans as against the Democrats and Prohibitionists.

THE COUNTY SUPERINTENDENCY.

It is time that the school directors of the county begin to look around for a competent person to fill the office of County Superintendent. The election will take place next May, and though it may seem early to talk about the matter, yet the importance of the office demands that it should be well considered before the election. There is no other office in the county so important as this. The person qualified for the position must have not only a good knowledge of the branches taught in the schools, but must understand the best methods of teaching and governing the schools. No milk-and-water man, or taffy man will answer the purpose. The Superintendent should be a man of good judgment, and capable of giving advice to teachers in everything that relates to their duties. We have had Superintendents who studiously fed the teachers, children, directors and people with taffy, by telling them that everything in the schools was going well, when they ought to have known, if they did not, that they did not tell the truth—that the schools really, of course with some exceptions, were wretchedly poor. We want a man who will give honest advice to the directors in everything in which they need information. We want a man who in all respects will be a credit to the county. Of all the men of the county, fit for the Superintendent, Charles W. Herman I believe to be far the best. He speaks both German and English, is a graduate of Lewisburg University, has taught public school in this county, and in counties of other States, nine or ten terms. He was an assistant teacher in the Missionary Institute at Solisgrove, where he prepared for college. He is about thirty years of age, therefore no mere beginner, and has had plenty of experience to make him fit for the office of Superintendent. He has also had normal training. I have been told that he prepared himself in one of our County Normals for teaching.

Mr. Herman comes from a good honest Snyder county family, and the directors would do themselves credit by electing him.

Winter Tours over the Pennsylvania Railroad.
