LETTER FROM HARRISBURG.

THE LEGISLATURE AT GETTYSBURG. Editor Middleburgh Post.

Gettysburg is being made historic for two things. It is the scene of the mightiest conflict of the Civil War and it is annually being visited by more people than in any other battle-field on this Continent.

It is here where nearly two hundred thousand soldiers were heaped upon each other to fight the decisive battle of the War and where a score of gallant leaders, Federal and Confederate bit the dust while directing their troops in a combat which for severity and the exhibition of courage and bravery has no parallel in the history of warfare.

Sixty thousand visitor yearly pay tribute to the spot where Meade and his Generals in 1863 consecrated the soil of Gettysburg by wresting from the Confederacy the triumph for which the Armies North and South had been contending for two years of continuous strife.

The Legislature, headed by the Government, left Harrisburg on Thursday morning the 21st, to visit the Battlefield of Gettysburg.

Adj. Genl. Hastings, Genl. Gobin Genl. Veazy, a Staff officer of the Vermont visiting party, and Mr. Hirsch were on horseback and led the tourists a lively pace over the grounds.

From this place the party was driven to Kulp's Hill, Cemetery Hill, Round Top, Little Round Top, the Peach Orchard, the Devil's Den and to the spot where Reynolds fell.

The monument in the cemetery, dedicated to the deeds of valor of the Union troops, is a splendid picture of soldierly heroism.
