AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION.

A proposed amendment to the Constitution of Pennsylvania, published by order of the Secretary of the Commonwealth, in pursuance of Article XVIII of the Constitution.

Joint resolution proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth, to be held in a referendum on the 1st day of November 1887.

Section 1. It shall have effect on and after the 1st day of November 1887, unless it shall have been previously approved by a majority of the members of the General Assembly...

Section 2. The following qualifications shall be required of every citizen who shall be eligible to vote at all elections...
