AUDITOR GENERAL NORRIS DEAD.

Colonel Wilson A. Norris, Auditor General of Pennsylvania died at his residence in Philadelphia, Monday morning at 7 o'clock. The immedia ate cause of his death was congestion of the brain, Col. Norris was in unusually good health and spirits at the time of the meeting of the late 2d, 1858, inclusive. Soon after the Convention he was taken suddenly ill, the result of a neglected cold, and was never able to rally. Colonel Norris was born in Lewistown, Pa., in 1842, and consequently at the time of his death was 46 years of age.
