Prepare for Voting.

The Presidential election will be held this year on Tuesday the 6th of November. Every citizen should be prepared to vote, and to vote as his honest judgement shall dictate. The following suggestions as to the qualification of electors should be carefully considered by all parties interested:

Native born citizens who will be between twenty-one or twenty-two years of age on election day, can vote without having been assessed or the payment of taxes. A citizen becomes twenty-one years of age on the day before his birthday. Thus one born on the 7th of November twenty-one years ago, can vote on age the 6th of November this year. The only requisite for a man voting on age is that he shall have resided in his present sixty days previous to the election.

Every citizen over the age of twenty-two years must be assessed at least sixty days before the election. That is, he must be assessed on or before the 6th of September next to qualify himself for voting at the Presidential election.

Every citizen over the age of twenty-two years must pay a State or county tax within two years preceding the election, and it must be paid not less than thirty days before election day. All who have not paid a State or county tax within two years, must pay such tax on or before the 6th of October this year to qualify them as electors.

Naturalized citizens, in addition to the usual tax and residence qualification, must be naturalized at least one month before they can vote. All who are eligible to naturalization and not yet fully naturalized, must obtain their papers from the courts on or before the 6th of September to qualify them as electors this year.

Citizens of other States must have a residence of one year in Pennsylvania to qualify them for voting, unless they were previously citizens of this State, when a residence of six months restores them to citizenship. Citizens of other States therefore, who have taken up their residence in Pennsylvania since the 6th of October last, cannot vote this year.

A change of residence within two months of the election, even if it is in the same ward or only across the street, disqualifies a citizen as a voter at the election.

There is often disputes as to the true residence of a citizen in case where men pursue their employment in different places. Residence is a question of intention on the part of the citizen, and unless the intention of the voter is in conflict with the law his own testimony is accepted as conclusive.

If it unsafe for citizens who require assessment, the payment of tax or naturalization to delay qualifying themselves as electors until the last days on which they can do so. Assessments should be carefully incurred into before the close of September.

Every citizen should hold his citizenship as too valuable to be the plaything of party committees, and he should look to his own assessment and the payment of taxes. The cost is so small that all can afford it who value the high prerogatives thereby conferred. Let every man qualify himself for voting, and then let him vote exactly as his best judgment dictates, regardless of leaders or parties.


