Dr Balliot on Common Sense in Ed-

This is an age in which "common sense," in the best sense of the words, is demanded. Let us apply it tonight to school work. Are we always. guided by common sense in our work as teachers? Let us see,

We wish to teach a boy to speak and write the English language correctly. Instead of making him talk and write, we have him learn definitions of the parts of speech, of case, person, gender, number, of mood, tense, etc., and memorize rules telling him how to talk.

We have him learn the definitions "by heart" as we say, but such work never reaches the heart. We ought to call it "learning by jaw," Now, Best made Clothing in does a farmer teach his son to plow in this way? Does he make him learn from a book definitions of plow, plow-share, handles, etc., and require him to memorize rules for hitching the horses to the plow ? We learn to do a thing by doing it, not by memorizing rules. The teaching of English grammar below the High School is useless and absurd. A child must learn the English language by hearing it spoken and by speaking and writing it.

Knowledge is the food of the mind, and the mind has an inborn desire for knowledge as the stomach has for food. By bad teaching you can destroy this appetite of the mind as by bad cooking you can destroy the stomach's appetite for food,

Now, after we have spoiled the child's appetite for knowledge, we bribe him to study by promising him a hundred per cent, for perfect lessons, or by detaining him after school or, possibly suspending him. What would a father do whose cook did her work so badly that his children Connected by w would refuse to eat their meals? Offer his children a hundred per cent. for eating all the beef steak, the bread, the potatoes, he dishes out for them, and would be promise to put the names of those who make a hundred per cent. on beef steak, bread and potatoes, in the county papers at the end of the month? Wouldn't common sense lead him to discharge the cook ! The time is coming when we shall have sense enough to do the same thing in edueation. A teacher who can't create a love of study in children has no place in the school room.

We grade teachers salaries according to the size of the children. Children that are two and a half feet high, can be taught for about \$30 a month; to teach children about three feet tall, teachers are paid about \$41, but to teach children from four and a-half to five and a half feet tall, in a high school, we pay all the way from \$70 to \$300 per month. Teachers of little children we stagmatize as "simply primary teachers."

Now grade the fees of your doctors in the same way and watch the result. When your physician attends your babe, offer him 25 cents a visit; when your grandfather is sick, pay him 83. He can afford to do "pri mary work" for 25 cents, when you pay only \$3 to do the "most advanced" work. Or, get a cheap doctor-a doctor who makes "primary medicine" a specialty—when your child is sick, and a good physician when G. W. Stahl, in Chapman township, at 10 o'clock your grandfather is sick and you will A. M. do what we are doing in school for your child in every school district in the United States. What does common sense say to all this ?

A little more of good sense applied to school work would revolutionize our teaching. What we need is the methods of the "business man" in education and less of those of the old fashioned pedagogue.


