BOSTON.—There was a fair movement in wool, confined mostly to small lots, and prices were without material change. Holders are not disposed to accept lower prices for wool which cost them high prices, and prefer to wait until manufacturers' stocks are partially exhausted and they are obliged to buy. Ohio and Pennsylvania fleeces have been selling at 33c for No. 34, 34c for No. 35, 35c for No. 36, and above and 36c for No. 1, Michigan X fleeces move slowly at 32c. In combing and delaine fleeces there have been small sales of No. 1 combing at 40c. Ohio fine d-wine at 30c, and Michigan fine delaine at 30c.
