The protracted meeting is still in progress. Thus far three persons have presented themselves at the altar of prayer. Rev. L. S. Reichard is still laboring with us.

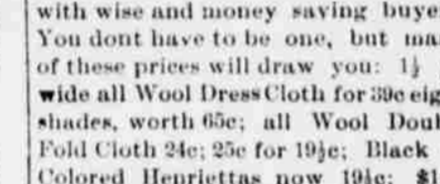
