Call For the Republican State Convention.

HEADQUARTERS REPUBLICAN STATE COMMITTEE, PHILA., April 23, '90.

The Republican State Convention will be held in the Opera House at Harrisburg, on Wednesday, June 25, 1890, at 10 o'clock a. m., for the purpose of nominating candidates for Governor, Lieutenant Governor and Secretary of Internal Affairs, and for the transaction of other business.

The attention of Republicans throughout the State is respectfully directed to the following Permanent Rules for the holding of State Conventions and the conduct of the party.

First. That Delegates to the State Convention shall be chosen in the manner in which candidates for the General Assembly are nominated.

Second. Hereafter the State Conventions of the Republican Party shall be held not earlier than the third Wednesday of August, except in the year of the Presidential election, when it shall be held not more than thirty days previous to the day fixed for the National Convention, and except in gubernatorial years. At least sixty days' notice shall be given of the date of the State Convention.

Third. That we recommend to the county organizations, that in their rules they allow the largest freedom in the general participation in the primaries consistent with the preservation of the party organization.

The State Convention of June 30, 1886, having abolished Senatorial representation, Delegates to the approaching State Convention will be selected according to the number of Representatives in the Legislature to which each county or city is entitled under the Representative Apportionment law passed by the Legislature of 1887.

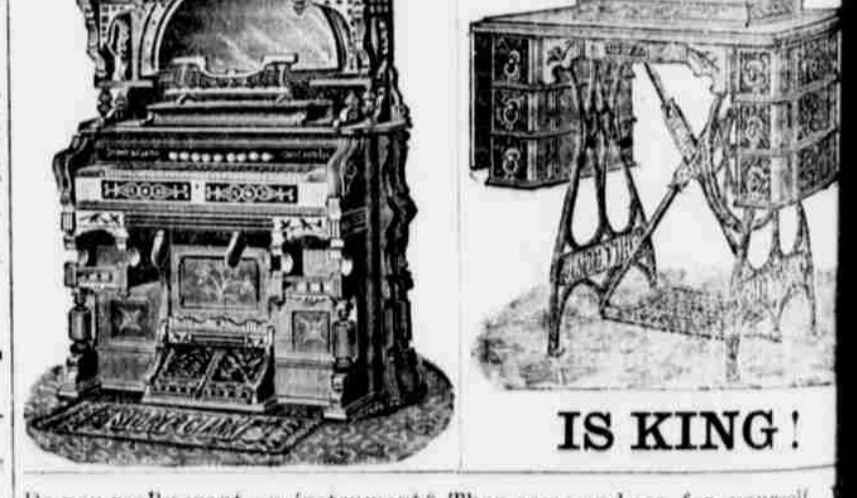
