

Senator Ingalls on Political Purity.

In the course of a recent interview with Senator Ingalls, the reporter suggested that he supposed the senator from Kansas held that whatever political purity may exist belonged exclusively to the Republican party.

"With the possible exception of the two terms of Washington," Senator Ingalls replied, "there has not been an absolutely fair, free and impartial expression of the deliberate will of the people in any presidential election since the foundation of the government. I doubt if there ever will be. Patronage will allure the ambitions, force will coerce the timid, demagogism will gull the credulous, fraud will rob the weak, money will buy the mercenary."

"Is it to be ever thus, senator?" "The purification of politics is an illusive dream. Government is force. Politics is a battle for supremacy. Parties are the armies. The decalogue and the golden rule have no place in a political campaign. The object is success. To defeat the antagonist and expel the party in power is the purpose. The Republicans and Democrats are as irreconcilably opposed to each other as were Grant and Lee in the Wilderness. They use ballots instead of bullets, but the struggle is as unrelenting and desperate, and the result sought for the same."
