ELECTION PROCLAMATION.

Election Proclamation.

BOLENDER, High Sheriff of Berks County, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, do hereby make known and give notice to the electors of the county aforesaid that an election will be held in the county, on TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 3, 1892, for the purpose of electing the persons hereinafter named, to wit:

Two persons for Presidential Electors;

Two persons for Congress at Large to represent the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in the Congress of the United States;

One person for Judge of the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania;

One person to represent the 18th congressional district of Pennsylvania in the

Congress of the United States;

One person to represent the 27th district in the Senate of Pennsylvania;

One person to represent Snyder county in the General Assembly of Pennsylvania;

One person for Associate Judge for Snyder county;

One person for Surveyor for Snyder county.

I also hereby make known and give notice that the place of holding election in the several wards, boroughs, districts and townships within the county of Snyder is as follows:

1st district, at the Odd Fellows' Hall, in Selinsgrove Borough.

2d district, at the house of John F. Boyer in and for Perry township.

3d district, at the house of David Hoffer in and for Chapman township.

4th district, at Boyer's Town Hall in and for Washington township.

5th district, at Ephriam Graybill's Hotel in and for Franklin township.

At all elections hereafter held under the laws of this Commonwealth, the polls shall be open at seven o'clock a. m., and closed

at 7 o'clock p. m.

Every person, excepting Justices of the Peace, who shall hold any office or appointment of profit or trust under the government of the United States, or of this State, of any city or incorporated district, whether a commissioned officer or otherwise, a subordinate officer or agent, who is or shall be employed under the legislative, executive, or judiciary department of this State or of the United States, or of any city, or incorporated district, and also that every member of Congress, and of the State Legislature, and of the select or common council of any city, or commissioners of any incorporated district, is by law incapable of holding or exercising at the same time, the office or appointment of judge, inspector or clerk

of any election of this Commonwealth, and that no inspector, judge, or any other officer of any such election shall be eligible to any office to be then voted for except that of an election officer.

The Inspectors and Judge of elections shall meet at the respective places appointed for holding the election in the district to which they respectively belong, before 7 o'clock in the morning, and each of those Inspectors shall appoint one clerk who shall be a qualified voter of said district.

The following is a list of all the nominations, and to be voted for, as far as may be, in the form in which they shall appear upon the ballots:
