A GIGANTIC PENSION FRAUD. A Norfolk Lawyer. Who Has Been Steal-

ing Large Sums, Arrested. The pension department at Washington believes it has unearthed stupendous pension frauds. An attorney of Nortolk, Va., W. R. Drewry, is under arrest, charged with securing fraudulent pension claims by the wholesale, using as his instruments in many cases colored men and women who could not read or write.

About three months ago Secretary Noble ordered three cases dropped from the reasion rolls that Drewry had secured, and later on he was debarred from practice. When the present administration came into power a thorough investigation was made into the cases that Drewry had secured and when it was concluded a few days since it was discovered that about 58 per cent of the cases he had handled under the act of June 27, 1850, were secured through the filing of

false declarations.

The extent of the frauds can be understood when it is stated that 166 cases were granted and that everyone of them carried granted and that everyone or them carried arrears. The steals will probably aggregate \$100,000. Drewry used the seal of a motary, R. A. Richardson, whose office he shared Richardson is said to have been ignorant of the use to which his seal had been juit, and Drewry has already been convicted of torging the notary's name and seal.

The Failure of the Columbia National Bank of Chicago had a Far-Reaching Effect. Most of the Suspended Institutions in Country Towns Where the Farmer Will Be the Loser.

The offic als of the Capitol National Bank Indianapolis, Ind., which closed its doors Friday say they will be able to resume busness within a few days providing the Chemical National Bank, of Chicago, is able to open its doors.

The failure of the Columbian National Bank, of Chicago caused banking institutions throughout Indiana to close their doors Friday. Most of them are small conerns, and the majority of their stock was swied by Dwiggins & Starbuck, of the Columbia National. Their capital stock ranged from \$20,000 to \$50,000. The Columbia National controlled about 27 banks in this State and more failures are anticipated The failures were: the Commercial State Bank, of Russiaville; Bank at Dunkirk; Farmers', of Greentown; Commercial Bank of Morristown; Commercial Bank, of Walkerton; Bank of Greenwood, of Greenwood: Farmers' and Merchants', of Geneva. The failure at Dunkirk was the heaviest. The liabilities are \$700,000 and the assets are reported about two thirds that amount.

The Indianapolis banks claim to be not affected by these failures.
