

Transient Merchants.

The following is a copy of the amendment to the law licensing transient retail merchants in cities, boroughs and townships, signed by the governor last week:

"That hereafter every person, whether principal or agent, not engaged in permanent business in any city, borough or township of this commonwealth, but entering into, beginning, or desiring to begin, a transient retail business in such city, borough or township, for the sale of any goods, wares, or merchandise whatsoever, whether the same shall be represented or held forth to be bankrupt, assignees, or 'about to quit business,' or of goods damaged by fire, water or otherwise, or by any attractive or conspicuous advertisement whatsoever, shall take out a license for the same from the proper authorities of said city, borough or township. The amount of such license in any city or borough shall be fixed by ordinance, duly passed by the councils of such city or borough, and the amount of such license in any township shall be fixed by the county treasurer and to be paid into the school fund of such township, to be used for school purposes, which license shall not be less than \$25 nor exceed the sum of \$1,000 per month, said license to be renewed monthly during the continuance of said sales, and upon failure of said person or persons to secure license, he or they shall be fined in a sum not less than \$100, to be collected as all other fines are by law collectable and in default of payment of said fines and costs, to be imprisoned for a period not exceeding thirty days."

As Old Log Church.—The Howarth church, in Upper Mahanoy township, a little log affair was built October 13, 1806, during Thomas Jefferson's administration as president of the United States. The church was owned jointly by the Lutheran and Reformed congregations. All these years it has stood in its original shape and generation after generation have heard the word of God preached from its little pulpit. The congregations of this generation have concluded to build a more modern structure in which to worship, and wishing to build the new one on the old site, the old log church was razed to the ground last month. When the corner stone was uncovered there was found therein, a bottle of port wine sealed with a glass stopper, the contents of which had evaporated but one gill being in the bottle, a half dollar of the date of 1806 and a penny dated 1801. What a world of history has transpired since this church was built. It was six years before the war of 1812, and the railroads, telegraphs, telephones, electric lights, electric cars, steam plows and other modern machinery were known to the people who worshipped around its altar in those days. What a pity it is that it was torn down. It would have been a fitting relic to have sent to the World's Fair and could well have been placed along side of the old liberty bell as a historic companion, but it is gone, and one of the oldest structures of Northumberland county is wiped out of existence. The contents of the old corner stone will be placed in that of the new.—*Sunbury Daily*.

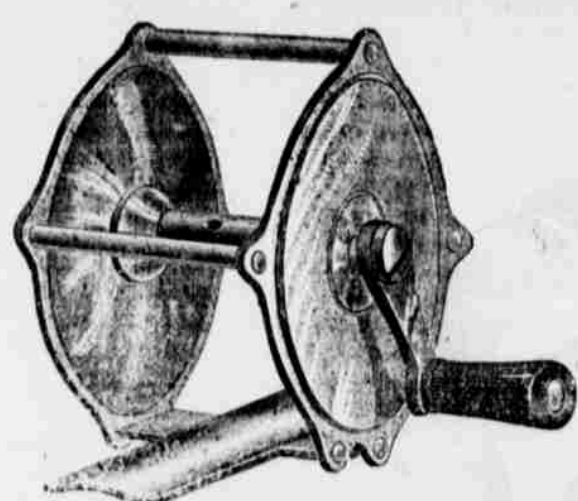
