ELECTION PROCLAMATION.

I, D. Bolender, High Sheriff of Snyder county, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, do hereby make known and give notice to the Electors of the County aforesaid that an election will be held in the said county on TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 7th, 1893, for the purpose of electing the several persons hereinafter named, to wit:—1 person for State Treasurer, 1 person for Judge of the Supreme Court, 1 person for Sheriff, 1 person for Associate Judge, 1 person for County Treasurer, 2 persons for County Commissioners, 2 persons for Auditors and 1 person for Coroner. IF A CROSS (X) BE MARKED WITHIN THE CIRCLE IT WILL BE EQUIVALENT TO A MARK OPPOSITE EVERY NAME IN THE COLUMN. THOSE WHO DO NOT DESIRE TO VOTE A STRAIGHT TICKET MUST NOT MARK A CROSS WITHIN THE CIRCLE AT THE HEAD OF THE COLUMN.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That every person, excepting Justices of the Peace, who shall hold an office or appointment of profit or trust under the United States or of this State, or any city or incorporated district, whether a commissioned officer or otherwise, a subordinate officer or agent, who is or shall be employed under the legislative, executive, or judiciary department of this state or of the United States, or of any incorporated district, and also that every member of Congress and the State Legislature, and of the select or common council of any city, or commission-

er of any incorporated district, is by law incapable of holding or exercising at the same time, the office or appointment of judge, inspector or clerk of any election of this Commonwealth, and that no inspector, judge or any officer of such election shall be eligible to be then voted for. The Inspectors and Judge of the elections shall meet at the respective places appointed for holding the election in the district to which they respectively belong, before seven o'clock in the morning, and each of those Inspectors shall appoint one clerk who shall be a qualified voter of such district.
