Galusha A. Grow Nominated.

The Republican State convention which met in Harrisburg Wednesday afternoon...

Ex-Senator Paeker, of Tioga, presided and the roll call showed that there were 257 delegates present.

In Mr Paeker's 15 minute speech, in which he announced the object of the gathering, he denounced the Wilson bill...

Ex-Attorney General Palmer, of Luzerne, nominated Galusha A. Grow. He began his speech by a reference to the closed work shops...

Then General Palmer turned to his candidate, and said Mr. Grow was a great exponent of tariff and spoke of the good he would do in Congress for protection.

Cleveland, James A. ... of Lehigh county, was named but he promptly declined, and Mr. Grow's nomination was made by acclamation and was unanimous.

Mr. Grow was then sent for and notified of his nomination. In a few minutes he appeared and, despite his 70 years, walked erect and firmly up the main aisle amidst the ovation tendered him by the delegates.

He took a position in the centre of the platform and thanked the Convention for the unanimous nomination for Congressman-at-large.

He proceeded to a comparison of the histories of the Republican and Democratic parties since 1860. He referred in scornful language to the Democratic newspapers which had referred to the present depression as a legacy of the Republican party.

He said the legacies of his party were sound money, the banking system, the protective revenue system.

He took up the Wilson bill and in some detail discussed its provisions. He declared it was a system intended to benefit foreign countries and the poverty-stricken labor of the world.

In conclusion he discussed President Cleveland's Hawaiian policy, and termed the first act of the present administration to be an effort to restore a "broken down monarchy."

Mr. Grow showed that he is vigorous both mentally and physically. His address was extremely forceful, and favorable comments upon it were generally made.
