

Shull and Baker at War.

War has again broken out between Jas. W. Shull, Esq., and Luke Baker, Esq., two Perry County lawyers. Last Wednesday while in the Perry County Court House, they used each other for 200 balls and punching bags, work coming out of the conflict with remnants of a contested cause. Black little Joe Kintner, the Mayor of New Bloomfield, as he did not have time to issue an ordinance for their adjournment, himself rushed into the "fistic" encounter, covered him with glory and was styled the "Peacemaker." At the instance of Baker, Shull was arrested on a charge of assault and battery. Our readers will remember that Shull and Baker had a fight in December in which Shull shot Baker twice. Shull was arrested, but no jury would convict him on account of the sympathy being largely in Shull's favor. This sympathy was due to the prevalence of an opinion that Baker had undue relations with Shull's wife.

SELINGROVE.

Thomas Barnes, wife, and child of Northumberland, spent a few days in this place. John Snyder of Liverpool paid a visit to his brother. We are pleased to hear that Dr. Boyd B. Bleeker and Chas. Haffley, two of our town's young men who left this place and embarked for Philadelphia several years ago, have lately purchased a large drug store in Germantown. Mr. Bleeker has successfully passed the examination before the State Board of Pharmacy which was held at Harrisburg several weeks ago. John Bousman came near meeting his death by drowning, he fell from the bridge into the river and was only saved by holding to the rubbish until he was rescued. The flood at this place was three inches higher than the same flood in '89 and about eighteen inches lower than in '95. Among the heaviest losers by the flood, at this place was Ed. M. Hummel, he having lost thousands of feet of lumber. The horses that Will Fisher and William Dresser had on Fisher's Island were saved. They stood in several feet of water since Sunday night. There are parts of several river bridges lodged against the bridge at this place, but have done no harm. Two spans of the trestling bridge across the Island have gone. About 75,000,000 feet of lumber were floated down the river—stick timber and boards by millions of feet. Two iron bridges that the County Commissioners put up in '89, one at this place and the other one about two miles below here have gone while the others are greatly damaged. The wooden bridges stood in a great deal better than the iron. Miss Emma McClees of Williamsport is visiting William Gertz's family. Quite a number of people from Middleburgh and Erbaugh were in this place on Tuesday taking in the sights.

New Uses for Aluminum.

New uses are constantly found for the pure metal aluminum, says the Popular Science Monthly; less employed in jewelry, it is most useful in the modest ranks of plated-ware and kitchen vessels. In Germany it has been introduced experimentally into the equipment of soldiers. Its alloy with the rare metal titanium, while light, is very hard and tough. Could not pick, bayonets, sabers and mess plates, imposing lighter loads on foot-soldiers, be made of it? The Russian army tried horseshoes of aluminum, and the horses of the Finnish Dragoons, on which the experiment was made, are said to have gained perceptibly in speed by it. It has been introduced into machines, to reduce the dead weight—a gain of special value for aerial navigation and for cycles. A canoe entirely of aluminum, all and machinery, has launched on the Lake of Geneva, and suggests a new resource for the bold explorer of river with numerous rapids in Africa and elsewhere.
