Edward Everett Hale on Colonial History

Dr. Edward Everett Hale, the veteran writer and lecturer, will give a course of lectures at the Summer Meeting of the American Society for the Extension of University Teaching to be held in Philadelphia during July, upon the Colonial period of our history, having particular reference to the mingling of the various elements of our composite population. Dr. Hale has made himself especially familiar with this period of our country's history, and his well-known power of making anything he touches upon interesting and instructive, will make his lectures one of the most profitable courses of the meeting which the Extension Society will offer. He will also accompany the Extension students on the historical excursions, which are a prominent feature of this Summer Meeting, and will add to the enjoyableness of these excursions. He will give an address at Boston to the students who will go upon the "Historical Pilgrimage," which will leave Philadelphia at the close of the Meeting, and go back over Washington's line of March up to Boston and surrounding towns of historic interest.

MONROE TOWNSHIP.


