## A New Political Party.

...toward the organization of a new political party. This movement is to be made a state affair and is probably instituted for the express purpose of pushing W. T. Kerr, State Counselor, of the Mechanics for Governor.

At the meeting a platform containing 16 planks was prepared and will be placed before the other lodges of the State for adoption. A convention will soon be called to nominate county and State tickets. The organization is named "The Progressive American Party." No attack is made on the Catholic church whatever, but the stand is taken that the present public school system shall not be interfered with by any one.

Protective tariff is favored, and a prohibitive immigration law demanded for a period of 25 years. Fiat money and even issue of currency by National banks is opposed to the end that the United States government alone shall have the sole power to issue all coin and paper money. National control of railroads is demanded and the recommendation made that all union veterans injured in the late war shall receive pensions of least \$8 per month.

We have interviewed several members of the P. O. S. of A. at this place and we learn that the platform of this "self-boasting" movement will reverse the cold shoulder by the local camp. If the movement is understood properly, we doubt whether any camp in the county will endorse the move. The members of that patriotic organization do not believe in making a secret order the backbone of a political movement.
