

Grand View Cemetery.

Your correspondent has frequently visited Grand View Cemetery at Johnstown, Pa. This beautiful burial ground is situated on a high hill about nine hundred feet higher than the city.

The visitors can ride up on the incline which is about one thousand feet in length or drive up to the burial ground on the road. The driveway gradually winds around the hill in the shape of an M. The graveyard has been well named. As you ascend on the incline or drive up to the place, you have a "grand view" of the city. The entrance from the road cemetery is an archway. The Stone arch bears the inscription, "In Memory of D. J. Merrell"—who had been a prominent citizen of Johnstown, and laid out Grand View Cemetery.

Just inside of the entrance a chapel has been erected for the use of funerals. There are a number of the monuments on the burial ground. The one that marks the grave of D. J. Merrell is a massive structure, forty feet high.

But what has made this graveyard famous in the history of the world is the fact that on Grand View "The Unknown," who were drowned in the great flood of 1889, are buried. A large, handsome monument, mounted with the Goddess of Liberty, marks their place of burial. The monument bears the following inscription: "The Unknown." For each grave there is a marker. There are about eight hundred of these markers which are arranged in rows back of the monument.

As your correspondent gazed on the "Unknown" plot he was deeply impressed with this great thought—The names of these dead are "Unknown" to man, but their names are known to God who is omniscient (knows all things) and he will find all of them in the great Resurrection Day, and will judge them according to the deeds done in the body, whether those deeds be good or evil.

Cold Weather Rules.

Never lean with the back upon anything that is cold.

Never begin a journey until the breakfast has been eaten.

Never take warm drinks and then immediately go out in the cold.

Keep the back, especially between the shoulder blades, well covered; also the chest well protected.

In sleeping in a cold room establish a habit of breathing through the nose and never with the open mouth.

After exercise of any kind never ride in an open carriage or near the window of a car for a moment. It is dangerous to health or even life.

When hoarse speak as little as possible until the hoarseness is recovered from, else the voice may be permanently lost or difficulties of the throat be produced.

Merely warm the back by a fire, and never continue keeping the back exposed to the heat after it has become comfortably warm. To do otherwise is debilitating.

When going from a warm atmosphere into a cooler one keep the mouth closed so that the air may be warmed in its passage through the nose before it reaches the lungs.

Never go to bed with cold or damp feet. Never omit regular bathing, for unless the skin is in active condition the cold will close the pores and favor congestion and other diseases.

Never stand still in cold weather, especially after having taken a slight degree of exercise, and always avoid standing on ice or snow, or where the person is exposed to cold wind.
