It is very likely that the bill will die in the Senate just as it did two years ago.

Crawford County Fence Bill.

Ordinarily very little opposition is encountered in the passage of a local law. This rule, however, is a notable exception in the attempt on the part of the Crawford county delegation to pass a bill compelling railroad companies, that run lines running through that county to build fences along such lines. This measure was defeated in the House on final passage after being passed the Senate.

It appears that some people can be friendly to farmers under certain circumstances. It looks as though there was an influence somewhere that favored railroads more than the people. The bill does not let Snyder county but notwithstanding cast my vote in favor of measure.

Senatorial Apportionment Bill.

The bill dividing the State into senatorial districts dismembers our district by joining Union Snyder to Millin, Juniata and Perry and uniting Northumberland and Montour as a separate district. The members of the district as situated at present are opposed to change.

Senator Penrose's Lesson Resolution Passed the Senate.

The preliminaries to the investigation of the workings of the Bullitt in Philadelphia have been taken, useless to speculate. There is to be an investigation and there be none. There is more than way to whip the Old Fellow and the stump. Wait and see.

Abolish the December Registry.

The bill that provides for the abolition of the December registry and the Senate finally and receive simply the signature of the Governor to become a law. Outside the large cities the bill was endorsed by all the boards of county commissioners and properly so because it will do away with a useless expenditure of thousands of dollars. The act will save this county between two and three hundred dollars.

Wood's Bridge Bill passed the House.

The bill providing that the State assume control of the bridges and to be erected over and across the rivers and streams which have been declared public highways and the House and is now in the hands of the Governor.

This is an important measure to the counties of the State. Particularly important to the people of this county at this time because of the movement to bridge Susquehanna river between Union and Port Trevorton. The bill becomes a law the State in the future pay for the construction and maintenance of the bridges over the public streams. If the bridge is to be built at the above place every tax payer in the county is anxious that the Governor sign the bill. Letters endorsing the bill with a request that the bill should be sent to the Governor at once.
