A BRUTE IN HUMAN FORM.

Rather than allow himself to be captured by the constables Wm. Etlinger shot himself at Woodward, Centre county, last week. On Thursday Constable Barner and two deputies attempted to arrest Etlinger on a Bench warrant. The latter had fortified himself in his house. Barner broke the panel in the door and while in the act of crawling through, Etlinger shot the constable in the head. The two deputies fled. The sheriff was notified and he brought a gang to storm the house and capture the prisoner.

So well fortified was the prisoner in his fortress that 2500 shots fired into the house was no argument for him to surrender. His wife and two small children were with him in the house. Citizens enraged at such outlaws gathered to the town and by eleven o'clock Friday 2000 people were there and the one man kept the mob at bay until eleven o'clock Friday, fire was set to the house and the occupants were compelled to surrender. The children were first given their liberty and then Mrs. Etlinger escaped from the cellar door, her enraged husband firing 3 shots at her as she flees, none took effect.

Etlinger then appeared, leveled his revolver toward his head and took his own life in the presence of the enraged mob. The dead body of Barner was removed from the burning building. Both bodies were buried and since then it has been learned Etlinger's body has been stolen. This in brief is the chapter of the most inhuman conduct on Pennsylvania soil by one who claims any degree of civilization. The fiendishness, brutality, ferocity and inhumanity exhibited by this colossal specimen of His Satanic Majesty is fitting evidence of Etlinger's depraved and savage condition.
