

FRANK C. BOWERSOX

Short Sketch of Our Popular County Superintendent.

The subject of this brief sketch first saw the light of day in Franklin township near the village of Paxtonville, on the 9th day of November 1857, which makes him a little more than 28 years of age. His father at the time of the subject's birth, was a sturdy young farmer. Four years later, the father entered the gospel ministry and was assigned a charge in Perry county. Next the family moved to Columbia county thence to Cumberland county and in the Spring of 1879 removed to Snyder county where they have since lived. After arriving at the age of 6 years, he attended the public school for about nine months of each year, in the various communities in which they lived until 1879. In this year the father broken down by hard and incessant labor returned to his native county to die. On the 28th day of October, 1879, that most terrible of all terrors—death—came and bore on fleeting wings the spirit of the lamented father. He lacked but a few days of being twelve years of age when this sorrowing crisis came. A mother with three children, of which the subject is the eldest, constituted the orphaned family. A new and most momentous question now arose. The bread winner and hitherto supporter and protector was gone. Young and untried hands as yet must be ushered into this arena to gain at least a partial livelihood. Consequently the subject was apprenticed on the farm, laboring with diligence for Messrs George Bowersox (his grandfather) Curtin Bowersox, A. S. Shambach, J. C. Schoch and Isaiah Bowersox, in all a period of five years. He was next employed by Chas. P. Swengle to haul iron ore from his mines around Adamsburg to the railroad and finally before going to college regularly, was employed almost two years by William Boyer in cutting saw logs and prop timber. The Spring of 1885 found him for the first time in Central Pa. College, New Berlin, Pa. Money wanting he was obliged to quit school and get to work. After earning and borrowing money sufficient to see him through school for a period of years, he began teaching school and clerking in store for Messrs. Seebold and Runkle. Then taught a select school in the summer of 1890 in Middleburgh and the year grade in the winter of the same year until January 1st, 1891, when he was elected clerk for the Commissioners of Snyder county. In this position he remained until at the triennial convention of School Directors which met in May, '93 when he was chosen County Superintendent. Mr. Bowersox has made a capable and faithful official. He has devoted all his time and energy to the upbuilding of the educational interests of our county. It has been his aim to arouse an educational zeal for better school facilities among the patrons and to this end has addressed hundreds of picnics, assemblies, and institutes all over the county. During the regular Commencement exercises of the Central Pa. College in June 1893, that institution conferred the degree of Master of Arts upon our worthy friend. Although the youngest Superintendent of Schools in the State, he did an immense amount of excellent work, having been employed as an instructor of Teachers' Institutes in Montour, Northumberland, Lycoming and Lebanon counties.

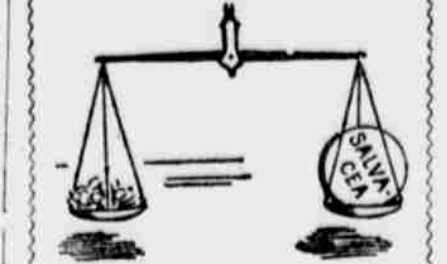
