Beaver Loses His Suit.

We clip the following from the Lewisburg News court proceed.

Sarah J. Beaver, trustee for Sarah J. Beaver, vs. George M. Slear, The defendant, George M. Slear, in 1876 gave to his wife a note at one day for a sum of money. The contention of the defendant is that where a wife loans money to a husband that she is not entitled to interest as she is proceeds of the husband's earyings or income, unless there is a specified contract that she is to receive interest. The plaintiff held that the general rule of law is that notes draw interest from maturity, and as this note matured after one day it would draw interest and that the note itself was a contract.
