Should be Located at Middleburgh.

An effort is being made to relieve the overcrowded penitentiaries by creating a new district to consist of the following named counties: Potter, Tioga, Bradford, Sullivan, Lycoming, Northumberland, Columbia, Montour, Fulton, Bedford, Cumberland, Franklin, Adams, Somerset, Blair, Cambria, Huntingdon, Union, Snyder, Dauphin, Lebanon, Perry, Juniata, Mifflin, Clearfield, Clinton, and Centre. A bill providing for the erection of another penitentiary for the district named is now in the legislature. It provides that a state penitentiary, capable of holding 500 prisoners at solitary confinement shall be erected at or near Harrisburg, the expense of which shall be defrayed by appropriations, to be expended under the direction of seven commissioners to be appointed by the Governor. It is proposed to erect a penitentiary on the plan of the eastern penitentiary at Philadelphia, and \$500,000 is appropriated for the purpose.
