Bucknell Commencement.

The 47th annual commencement of Bucknell University this week was held at Lewisburg. The Junior debate took place on Saturday night last. On Sunday morning President Harris delivered the baccalaureate sermon. The school of music held its commencement exercises on Monday morning. On Monday afternoon the Institute Alumnae met. On the evening of the same day the Ringgold band, of Reading, gave the first twilight concert. At 8 o'clock, on the above evening, Pres. B. L. Whitman, D. D., of Columbia University, addressed the graduates. On Tuesday morning the college Seniors held class day and the Academy graduation took place. On Tuesday afternoon the young ladies of the Institute graduated. The class of '72 banqueted in "Bucknell Hall and the Ringgold band gave the second twilight concert. On Tuesday evening the Alumni met in Bucknell Hall and the fraternities banqueted. On Wednesday morning the college Seniors graduated when Judge Ashman, of Philadelphia, addressed the class and at noon the corporation dinner took place. On same afternoon the Ringgold band gave a concert during the base ball game.

This has been a very successful year with Bucknell. The University graduated 93 from all departments this commencement. The total enrollment for the year was 433 students.
