Postmasters Are Authorized to Cash the Same.

It has been decided by the postoffice department to permit postmasters to cash pension checks and remit such checks to the respective depositories in lieu of the corresponding amount of cash. The pensioner presenting the check must be known personally to the postmaster. It is not expected that the checks will be presented to postmasters at the large places where there are banks, this arsingement being intended merely to add to the convenience of the soldiers and to enable them to avoid the expense which now frequently attaches to the negotation of their checks. It is believed that through the method some millions of dollars ill be 1 aid the pensioners through e money order system of the dertment, and without any expense natever.
