It is an extraordinary thing in American life that a man with wealth and Public Sin and opportunity should be content to go down into history as a corrupter of the state and as the holder of an office which he could obtain only by the use of money. The result of such work is only too evident, says a writer in the Philadelphia Saturday Evening Post. It lowers the whole tone of a commonwealth, and stains even society and the church. Bribery, whatever its form, by letting down the bars of morality contributes directly to crime, and its evil influences discourage and dismay people of good consciences, who give up hope and find recourse in that fatal indifference which expresses itself as: "What's the use? Money will win anyhow, and one dollar is as good as another." Even more extraordinary is that condition of mind which not only tolerates these men after they have succeeded in their plans and purposes, but in a way makes leaders and heroes of them. The effect is always bad. Public character and private honor both suffer. Good people become pessimistic and hadambitions grow more bold. Fortunately, however, there is a new tendency in our affairs and there is coming a time when a man may not commit sin politically and then expect to keep a good name in private life. The two things cannot be dissociated. They must be judged by the same standards and there is never a compromise between good and evil. The bought office disgraces not only the office itself but its purchaser.

There is a warning for fussy married men in the story of the Binghamton (N. Y.) couple who recently fell out because of the husband's criticisms of his wife's cooking. They had been married only a few months and this culinary cloud appears to have been the only one on their sunny domestic horizon. One night the husband said something particularly aggravating about the lady's burnt steak, or her heavy biscuits. Perhaps he compared them in the traditional way to mother's. Anyway, it was something dreadfully irritating, because the goaded woman arose up in her wrath and impaled him good and hard on the tines of a fork. That ended the discussion, as well as the young husband's further interest in eatables of any sort. AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION PROPOSED TO THE CITIZENS OF THIS COMMONWEALTH FOR THEIR APPROVAL OR REJECTION BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA. LISHED BY ORDER OF THE SECRETARY OF THE COMMONWEALTH IN PURSUANCE OF ARTICLE XVIII OF THE CONSTITUTION.

A JOINT RESOLUTION
Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth in General Assembly met, that the following is proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth in pursuance of the provisions of the eighteenth article thereof:

Amendment One to Article Eight, Section One. Add at the end of the first paragraph of said section, after the words "shall be entitled to vote at all elections," the words "subject however to such laws requiring and regulating the registration of electors as the General Assembly may enact," so that the said section shall read as follows:

Section 1. Qualification of Electors. Every male citizen twenty years of age, possessing the following qualifications, shall on election day be entitled to vote at all elections, subject however to such laws requiring and regulating the registration of electors as the General Assembly may enact:

1. He shall have been a citizen of the United States at least one month.

2. He shall have resided in the State one year or if having previously been a qualified elector of the State, he shall have resided in the State for one year and returned within six months immediately preceding the election.

3. He shall have resided in the election district where he shall offer his vote at least two months immediately preceding the election.

4. If having previously been a qualified elector, he shall have paid within two years a State or county tax, which shall have been assessed at least two months and paid at least one month before the election.

Amendment Two to Article Eight, Section Seven. Strike out from said section the words "that no elector shall be deprived of the privilege of voting by reason of his name not being registered," and add to said section the following: "and add to said section the following: 'The registration of electors may be conducted by any method or in any form, provided that such laws may be uniform for cities of the same class' so that the said section shall read as follows:

Section 7. Uniformity of Election Laws—All laws regulating the holding of elections by the cities or for the registration of electors shall be uniform throughout the State, but laws regulating the registration of electors may be enacted to apply to cities only, provided that such laws be uniform for cities of the same class.

AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION OF THE COMMONWEALTH FOR THEIR APPROVAL OR REJECTION BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA. LISHED BY ORDER OF THE SECRETARY OF THE COMMONWEALTH IN PURSUANCE OF ARTICLE XVIII OF THE CONSTITUTION.

A JOINT RESOLUTION
Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met that the following is proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth in pursuance of the provisions of the eighteenth article thereof:

Amendment. Strike out section four of article, eight, and insert in place thereof, as follows:

Section 4. All elections by the citizens shall be by ballot or by such other method as may be provided by law. Provided, that secrecy in voting be preserved.
