Fire losses in England amount to 62 1/2 per cent. of all premiums paid. Experiments have been made in the Swiss army on the effect of smoking on the march. The results were in favor of the troops that were allowed to have their pipes, and moreover their discipline was better. The United States government has increased its holdings on Staten Island by a purchase of several acres on the water front near Fort Wadsworth, for the purpose of giving the 14-inch gun a clear sweep over the waters of the bay. Gen. Buller once explained why it was necessary to put such showy clothing on most of the troops. "Because a showy uniform attracts Mary Ann, the nursemaid, who makes Tommy Atkins join the army. In plain uniforms, you would find recruiting a harder job than ever." The marriageable daughters of the English aristocracy are hastening to the altar with lords, earls and marquises as fast as they can, in order to get in on the ground floor when the coronation takes place. Matrimony is more than popular in exalted circles, according to the latest dispatches.

**Destroy the Vines Now.**  
 The best possible disposition that can be made of the melons, squash and cucumber vines is to pull them up, and, when sufficiently dry, pile and burn them. Left upon the ground they become the shelter and breeding place of the next year's crop of beetles, and their value for manure will in no way compensate for the damage accruing if left upon the ground. 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One of the members of the United States geological survey recently called attention to a striking contrast in the development of the country lying on each side of the boundary line between Oregon and Idaho. In southwestern Idaho, near Boise City and the state line, there is a considerable section well developed by irrigation. Owing to the combined advantages of the rich character of the soil, the favorable conditions of the climate and irrigation, this district contains some of the best fruit-growing country in the world. Just on the other side of the state line, in Oregon, along the Malheur and Owyhee rivers exactly the same conditions exist—rivers, soil and climate—with the exception of the application of water to the land by irrigation, the vital condition. In consequence this section, though but a few miles distant from the other and just as capable of high development, is a desert country. Here is the whole important question of irrigation in the arid west in a nutshell, with it, homes, farms and industry; without it, a desert.
