WHEN BEES SWARM.

Month of June is the Usual Time, But Sometimes They Go Out as Early as April.

Any one can tell just about the day a colony of bees will swarm, if they go to the trouble of acquainting themand months, and then are liable to be off their guard just when the swarm comes. In the first place, colonies must get very strong before taking the swarming fever, and usually even then they are not likely to swarm unless Bees swarm more largely during the


