### Entitled to Another Degree.

Prof. Simon Newcomb is unquestionably the oldest and most eminent of living American scientists. The degree of doctor of philosophy was conferred upon him recently by the University of Christiania. Previous to this he had received similar degrees from 12 different institutions including a D. D. from Yale, Columbia and Harvard.

An associate, complimenting him upon his honors, was surprised to learn that the professor still desired another degree to satisfy his ambition.

Curiosity drew forth the following explanation from Prof. Newcomb: "Another degree should be conferred upon me for the remarkable feat performed in remembering all of my degrees."

## DRUM WITH HISTORY

Captured at Bunker Hill by Revolutionary Troops.

It Bears the Scars of Battle, But Retains Its Tone to Perfection—Relic Now Owned by G. A. R. Post.

One of the most valuable historical relics in the United States is an English snare drum, the property of Richard A. Pierce post, G. A. R., of New Bedford, Mass. Several American historical societies have long tried to secure possession of it, for it is of revolutionary fame, and probably is the only one in existence which is associated with the first battle for American independence—Bunker Hill.

It is battle scarred and battered and bears the marks of service in that historic battle, when the men of 1775 determined to no longer stand the oppression of the mother country.

It has been in the family of Levi Smith, of Providence, R. I., until recently, when Israel Smith, Jr., the leader of the famous Thirty-third Massachusetts regiment band, now a resident of New Bedford, presented it to the post of which he is a comrade, and it is safe to say that they will not part with it until the great majority of that organization have joined their comrades who sleep in peace. Then it will adorn some conspicuous place in one of the government buildings at Washington.

It descended to Israel Smith, Jr., from his grandfater, Levi Smith, who was a drummer boy in one of the Rhode Island companies, which followed the Quaker soldier, Gen. Nathaniel Greene, to Massachusetts, to lend aid to the cause so dear to the heart of every loyal American.

When given to the grandfather of Mr. Smith that gentleman on his first furlough took it with him to his home in Providence, and after repairing a piece of the barrel, which had been knocked out by a bullet and bracing the barrel on the inside, made this relic of Bunker Hill serviceable, and used it during the balance of his term as a revolutionary soldier.

The grandfather was an expert on such an instrument, as was also his

son, and it is due to their knowledge that this British drum is today preserved for the present generation. With a continuance of the care which is given it, it will long remain an object of interest to all students of American history.

It is a relic which descended to the leading historical societies of the country, having knowledge of its existence, to make arrangements to the Smith family for its purchase. It is now on display in some of the modern museums. Levi Smith, Jr., recently the venerable band leader, purchased the drum in the possession of a Boston Globe reporter, sounding the war-beats in army life during the civil war.

It is much larger than the snare drum in use now. Inside of the barrel, which by the way is cracked nearly half around the circumference, can be seen the name, although somewhat obliterated, of the maker, whose name of business was London. A silver plate descriptive of the drum's importance has been placed on the barrel, which reads as follows:

"This British drum was captured at Bunker Hill, and assigned by Gen. Levi Smith, drummer in the continental army. Descended to his son, Israel Smith, a soldier of the war of 1812. Descended to his son, Israel Smith, leader of the band of the Thirty-third Massachusetts infantry, the headquarters band which marched with Sherman from Atlanta to the sea in 1864, and presented by him to R. A. Pierce post, 105, department of Massachusetts, G. A. R."

The story, as told by Mr. Smith, was, when a lad, got it from his grandfather, is a belief one. The son who carried the drum when the Britishers made their first attack on Breed's hill, was shot down at the first volley, and the barrel of his drum almost riddled with bullets. After the second assault, and while King George's troops were being rallied for their third and successful attack, one of the members of the Rhode Island company in question went over the intrenchments and carried back with him this relic.

Taken to the company after the British had taken the hill, the men in the company drew lots for its possession, and afterward, by unanimous consent, gave it to the Rhode Island drummer boy, Levi Smith.

At the beginning of the last century, Levi Smith, the grandfather, gave it to his eldest boy, Israel, Jr., and he had it redecorated by S. Brown, of Providence, who adorned it with coats of arms of the United States and Rhode Island, while near the top were the initial letters of his father, "L. S."
