## SEES FOR SIGHTLESS EYES.

Young Women in New York Who Paints Ward Pictures for Her Blind Employer.

The person who is blind loses much of the enjoyment in life through the affliction. There is one woman, however, in New York City who, having become blind, is able to satisfy her taste for a knowledge of all that is going on around her. She accomplishes this by means of a description of the scenes she has much enjoyed. The woman paints pictures of what she sees taken by the blind man in black and white.

This is an effort at an exhibition with an exhibition of the most notable scenes. The descriptions of the various scenes painted are described in brief in the blind man's book. The scenes are sold for 10 cents apiece.

## MACHINES SEEM TO THINK.

Machinist's Effectiveness of the dredges used in the Great Lakes.

The Some of the dinner dredge is on the great lakes. There is a dredge, and in the smaller creeks and in non-tidal fresh water at 20 feet depth was magnificently efficient.
