### ANCIENT HIGH PRIEST FOUND

Mommy of Egyptian Buried 4,000 Years Ago Uncarthed by German Explorers.

The German Oriental society has been most successful in its explorations at Abu-Sir in Egypt, and most interesting "finds" were distributed among the Berlin museums during the month of October. One of the most important discoveries was a perfectly preserved mummy of Jen Em Jechvet, the high priest of the temple, who died about 2,000 years before Christ. The body was found in a family vault, which also contained the remains of

his priest and reader and their wives, Only three tombs of such an age have been found in good preservation during the last century, and this is the first time that the contents have been brought safely to Europe. Jen lay in his coffin, enveloped in a brown linen shroud, just as he had been placed there 4,000 years ago. In accordance with the fashion of the time, he has small side whiskers, and a longer tuft on his chin, and his eyes are made to appear unnaturally long by means of the careful application of rouge. NOTES AND COMMENTS

One very notable thing brought out by the study of the early Christian church is the broadening of the thought of the disciples. At first, it will be remembered, the church consisted of Jews and those Gentile proselytes who had fully accepted Juda ism. They wanted all the world to betome Christians, but thought it necessary that Gentiles should first our form to the rites and teachings of the law of Moses. In spite of this idea, however, the Gospel gradually was extended among the Samaritana. then to occasional devout Gentiles, until the church at Anticch admitted all, though with certain restrictions on the non-judicial adherents. Finally the Gospel was preached and the church opened to all who accepted Jesus as Lord and Saviour.

Coincident with the extension in thought was the extension in territory. For a few years the church at Jerusalem was the only Christian shurch in the world. Then, as persecution scattered the disciples, other churches took root in other parts of Palestine, in Syria, and then in Caesarea, Samaria, Damasons and Antioch. This latter city came in time to be a center of missionary activity, and from there Paul and others made preaching excursions into the towns of Asia Minor, Macedonia, breece and Italy. It is even probable that the Gospel was carried as far westward as Spain, southward into Ethiopia, and eastward into Assyrfa, Persia, and possibly India.
