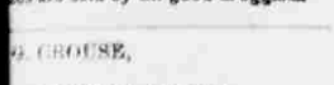

CATCHING CRABS FOR MARKET.

Ingenuous Method by Which Large Numbers Are Procured from a Maryland River.

Those who crab for market on the Choptank river, Maryland, have an ingenious method of catching crabs in quantities, says Country Life in America. A rope about the thickness of a clothesline, several hundred feet long, is kept coiled in a keg.

When the other end is reached by anchors it with another rope, and leaves out another rope. After operating they takes his stand on the bow of his boat. A longline of him is laid out with a handle of feet long.

When a crab stings to its attachment, comes a slight sideways jerk, dashes it under the crab and thrusts it into the boat.
