Grand Jury Finds True Bills Against Nine People.

THREE OF ACCUSED ENTER BAIL

Mayer of Lock Haven, Pa. Among Parties Indicted, For Whom Warrants Have Been Issued Other Indictments Expected Later.

Washington, Aug. 1.- The post office investigation developed another sensation, the federal grand jury returning seven indictments, involving nine people, for alleged conspiracy and bribery in connection with postal affaire. August W. Machen, formerly the head of the free delivery service, was named tointly with others in four of the indictments. The other parties were William Gordon Crawford, who was deputy auditor for the post office department from June 19, 1898 to September 14. 1897, and is a member of one of the exclusive elubs of this city. No Successor to Leo XIII Has Yet Been Chesen.

ROME IS BECOMING IMPATIENT

Great Disappointment Was Manifest ed and There Were Cries of Disappointment and Derision - Cardinal Herrere Dying of Heart Fallure.

Rome, Ang. 4 .- After three full days of deliberation, during which six ballots have been taken, the members of the conclave still remain shut up in the Vatican without having selected a successor to Leo XIII. The futility of the ballots taken was evidenced by the smoke which arose from the Sistine This last mute signal was watched by another large crowd, which partly filled the square of San Pletro and which it was estimated numbered about 15,000. Great disappointment was was manifested, and when the little puff of smoke appeared there were loud eries, not only of disappointment, but

Rome is becoming extremely impa tient over the delay in the selection of the new pope, concerning which there appears to be no definite explanation. owing to the rigid secreey with which the proceedings within the conclave are being guarded. Practically the only news which came from the Sisting chapel was that of the extremely grave tilness of Cardinal Herroro. It is presumed, however, that the other aged cardinals are also suffering from their prolonged incarceration and the intense heat.

Among ambaggadors and ecclesiastics there exists a general opinion that, it only for the sake of relieving the aged cardinals much may be sacrificed within the conclave to arrive at a speedy conclusion. On the other hand, there are those

who are pessimistic enough to believe that the hostility among the factions in the sacred college is so bitter that the struggle may be continued for neveral weeks. This view, however, finds little credence.

Out of all the rumors and gossip which is affoat concerning what is transpiring in the conclave, the most persistent report is to the effect that the Rampolla and Serafino Vannutelli factions have remained compact. and that the attempt of one faction to press forward a new candidate in the hope of breaking the strength of the other had failed The Ralia says that matters have reached a point which presages the possibility of the election of a foreign pope, and that Cardinal Kopp, bishop of Breslau, who is most frequently mentioned in this connectien, has the support of the German emperor If this is true, the Italia interprets it as a move on the part of the Mampolia faction to win over the Austro-German cardinals from Serafino Venno elli

Those who are superstitious are paying that as the conclave opened on St. Ignatius Loyola day it will probably close today, the day of St. Dominic one of the fighting saints in the calendar, thus fulfilling the prophecy of St. Michael, who predicted that the motte of the next pope would be "Ignis ardens

It is stated that on the request of Oardinal Herrero himself the vicar genera of his archdiocese of Valencia. Spain, who accompanied the cardinal to Rome, was allowed to enter the conclave and visit him. The cardinal is affected with heart disease. As the carriage stopped at the church door the president scool ty annoyed at the insult offered to Mrs. Roosevelt and the children, alighted and directed the attention of the secret service officers to the man and orders that he be competted to leave the vicin ity of the church, McCann bestated when ordered to move on, but as se officer was about to stimulate his move ments he sprang on hid wheel and rose away rapidly. While the Incident was annoying to the president and his family, it is his dontre that no action be taken against the man.
