Fortunately for our dealers he found no violations of the laws and regulations governing empty packages. We would advise our readers who handle cigars and tobacco to be exceedingly careful to scratch the stamps on all empty cigar and tobacco boxes in such a manner as to totally destroy them, as the Revenue Officers are especially active in that branch of the service at this time, and the penalty for failure to comply with the law is fifty dollars.
