The Committee on Labor, Income and Revenue, invite co-operation with them in the particular work for which they have been appointed. The interest on this debt for the coming fiscal year will be \$45,927,126, while the customs revenue in gold for the current fiscal year, ending June 30th, 1864, has been so far at the rate of over \$100,000,000 per annum.
