

JOINT RESOLUTION, PROPOSING CERTAIN Amendments to the Constitution.

Be it resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met: That the following amendments be proposed to the Constitution of the Commonwealth, in accordance with the provisions of the tenth article thereof: There shall be an additional section to the third article of the Constitution to be designated section four, as follows: Whenever any of the qualified electors of this Commonwealth shall be in any active military service, under a requisition from the President of the United States, or by the authority of the Commonwealth, such electors may exercise the right of suffrage in all elections by the citizens, under such regulations as are or shall be prescribed by law, in as full and as equal a manner as if they were present at their usual place of election.

Section 5. There shall be two additional sections to the seventh article of the Constitution, to be designated as sections, respectively, the proposed amendments be passed by the legislature, containing more than one subject which shall be clearly expressed in the title, except appropriations bills. Section 9 No bill shall be passed by the Legislature granting any power, or conferring any privilege, in any case, where the authority to grant such power, or privilege, has been or may hereafter be conferred upon the courts of this Commonwealth.

Section 10. I do hereby certify that the foregoing is a full, true, and correct copy of the original Joint Resolution of the General Assembly, entitled "A Joint Resolution proposing certain Amendments to the Constitution," as the same remains on file in this office.
