SECTION 4. Whenever my of the qualified electors of this Commonwealth shall be in any active military service, under a requisition from the President of the United States, or by the authority of the Commonwealth, such electors may exercise the right of suffrage in all elections by the citizens, under

regulations as are or shall be, prescribed by as fully as it they were present at their usual ce of election." Section 2. There shall be two additional sections to the eleventh article of the Constitution, to be designated as sections, eight and nine, as follows:

"SECTION S: No bill shall be passed by the legislature, containing more than one subject which shall be clearly expressed in the tile, except appropriation bills?"
