**NOTICE.**  
For the Benefit of Soldiers Orphans.

By an act of the Legislature of Pennsylvania approved May 9, 1864, the Governor was authorized to receive the sum of fifty thousand dollars, offered by the Pennsylvania Railroad Company, "for the education and maintenance of destitute orphan children of deceased soldiers and sailors."

The persons entitled to the benefits of this Act are the "children of either sex under the age of fifteen, resident in Pennsylvania at the time of the application, and dependent upon either public or private charity for support, on the exertions of a mother or other person destitute of sufficient property for education and maintenance, of fathers who have been killed or died of wounds received or of disease contracted in the service of the United States, whether in volunteer or militia regiments of this State, or in the regular army of the naval service of the United States, but who were at the time of entering such service, actual bona fide residents of Pennsylvania."

Such children will be boarded, clothed and educated; those under the age of six years, in any suitable school that will receive them on proper terms; and those over six years of age, in one of the State Normal Schools.

The application must be made "by the mother, if living, if not by the guardian or next friend."

Persons representing such orphans as above described can receive information, blank forms, and all necessary assistance by application to either of the undersigned.

**A JOINT RESOLUTION,**  
PROPOSING CERTAIN  
Amendments to the Constitution.

Be it resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, That the following amendments be proposed to the Constitution of the Commonwealth, in accordance with the provisions of the tenth article thereof:

There shall be an additional section to the third article of the Constitution to be designated section four, as follows:

Section 4. Whenever any of the qualified electors of this Commonwealth shall be in any active military service, under a requisition from the President of the United States, or by the authority of the Commonwealth, such electors may exercise the right of suffrage in all elections by the citizens, under such regulations as aforesaid shall be prescribed by law as fully as if they were present at their usual place of election."

Section 2. There shall be two additional sections to the eleventh article of the Constitution, to be designated as sections eight and nine as follows:

"Section 8. No bill shall be passed by the Legislature, containing more than one subject which shall be clearly expressed in the title, except appropriation bills."

"Section 9. No bill shall be passed by the Legislature granting any powers, or privileges, in any case, where the authority to grant such powers, or privileges, has been or may hereafter be conferred upon the courts of this Commonwealth."

The above Resolution having been agreed to by a majority of each House at two successive sessions of the General Assembly of this Commonwealth, the proposed amendments will be submitted to the people, for their adoption or rejection, on the FIRST TUESDAY OF AUGUST, in the year of our Lord, one thousand, eight hundred, and sixty-four, in accordance with the provisions of the tenth article of the Constitution, and the aforesaid and the act entitled, "An act prescribing the time and manner of submitting to the people, for their approval or rejection, the proposed amendments to the Constitution," approved the twenty-third day of April, one thousand, eight hundred and sixty-four.
