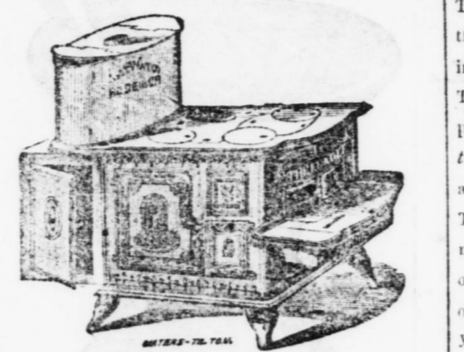

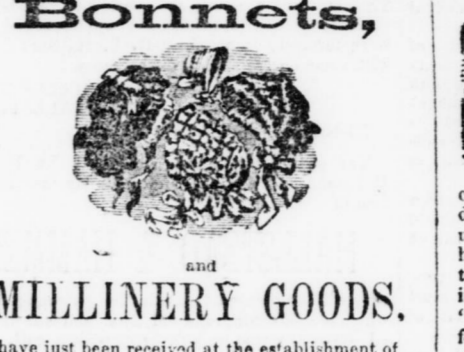

**It will be seen that even the present gold revenue of the Government are largely in excess of the wants of the Treasury for the payment of gold interest, while the recent increase of the tax will doubtless raise the annual receipts from customs on the same amount of importations, to \$150,000,000 per annum.**

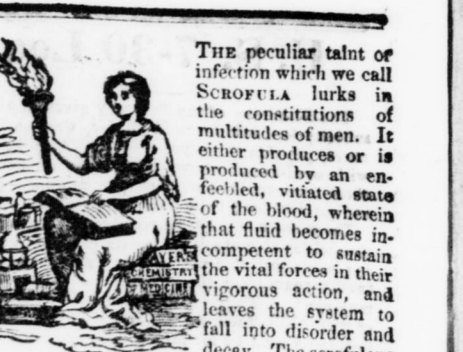
