

for inspector shall not attend, the person elected judge shall appoint an inspector in his place, or if any vacancy shall continue in the board for the space of one hour after the time fixed by law for the opening of the election, the qualified voters of the township, ward or district for which said officer shall have been elected, present at the place of election, shall select one of their number to fill such vacancy.

It shall be the duty of the several assessors, respectively, to attend at the place of holding the general, special or township election during the time said election is kept open, for the purpose of giving information to the inspectors and judges when called on in relation to the right of any person assessed by them to vote at such election, or in such other matters in relation to the assessment of voters as the said inspectors, or either of them shall from time to time require.

Pursuant to the provisions contained in the 76th section of the act first passed, the judges of the several districts shall, respectively, take charge of the certificate or return of the election of their respective districts and produce them at the meeting of one judge from each district at the borough of Tankhannock, on the third day after the FRIDAY, the 14th day of OCTOBER, next, and there to do and perform the duties required by them by law of said judges.

Also that when any judge or assessor or assessor elect is unable to attend such meeting of judges, then the certificate or return assessed as if taken charge of by one of the inspectors or clerk of the election of said district, who shall do and perform the duties required of said judges unable to attend.

JOHN P. PENNY, PROPOSING CERTAIN Amendments to the Constitution.

Be it resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met: That the following amendments be proposed to the Constitution of the Commonwealth, in accordance with the provisions of the tenth article thereof.

SECTION 1. There shall be an additional section to the third article of the Constitution to be designated section four, as follows:

SECTION 2. Whenever any of the qualified electors of the Commonwealth shall be in any active military service under a commission from the President of the United States, or by the authority of the Commonwealth, such electors may exercise the right of suffrage in all elections by the citizens, under such regulations as are or shall be, prescribed by law as fully as if they were present at their usual place of election.

SECTION 3. There shall be two additional sections to the seventh article of the Constitution, to be designated as sections eight and nine, as follows:

SECTION 8. No bill shall be passed by the Legislature granting any powers, or privileges, in any case, where the authority to grant such powers, or privileges, has been or may hereafter be conferred upon the courts of this Commonwealth.

SECTION 9. No bill shall be passed by the Legislature granting any powers, or privileges, in any case, where the authority to grant such powers, or privileges, has been or may hereafter be conferred upon the courts of this Commonwealth.

SECTION 10. No bill shall be passed by the Legislature granting any powers, or privileges, in any case, where the authority to grant such powers, or privileges, has been or may hereafter be conferred upon the courts of this Commonwealth.

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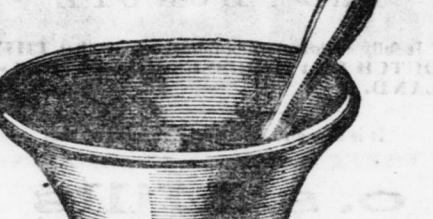
