Pursuant to the provisions contained in the 76th section of the act first aforesaid, the judges of the aforesaid districts shall, respectively take charge of the certificate or return of the election of their respective districts and produce them at the meeting of one judge from each district at the borough of Tunkhamock, on the third day after the day of the election, being for the present year on FRIDAY, the 14th day of CCTOBER prox., then and there to do and perform the duties required by them by law of said judges.
