when called on in relation to the right of any person assessed by them to vote at such elections, or such other matters in relation to the assessment of voters as the said inspectors, or either of them shall from time to time require.

Pursuant to the provisions contained in the 76th section of the act first aforesaid, the judges of the aforesaid districts shall, respectively take charge of the certificate or return of the election of their respective districts and produce them at the respective districts and produce them at the meeting of one judge from each district at the borough of Tunkhannock, on the third day after the day of the election, being for the present year on FRIDAY, the 11th day of NOVEMBER prox., then and there to do and perform the duties required by them by law of said judges.

Also that where a judge by sickness or unavoid able accident is unable to attent such meeting of judges, then the certificate or return aforesaid shall be taken charge of by one of the inspectors or clerk o the election of said district, who shall do and perform the duties required of said judges unable to attend.
