Manufacture of Woolen Goods: CHAPTER I.

The Manufacture of Woolen Goods, both in the household and in the factory has become of great importance on account of its forming at present our principal articles of clothing.

The first process with the farmer who intends to make his wool into rolls for spinning is in weaving at home, after washing and scouring, is assuring the staples. This we do not expect a farmer to do as effectively as a regular manufacturer, but by trying

he will approximate towards it, and be amply paid for the little pains required, by having an even thread and smoother fabric. The fleece should be

whole and spread out on a table—the coarsest wool will be found on the skirts of the fleece, and can easily be distinguished by looking closely to the fibre. Two qualities from each fleece will perhaps

be close enough for ordinary purposes, but as the sheep in our country differ much in their grades of wool—in regard to length, fineness, and elasticity—the

wool in pressing out the wrinkles, the cloth will require its contraction again, which may be done in a garment, and the mechanic is sometimes wrought-blamed for a coat becoming lumpy when a man's back.

It is easily avoided by giving the wheel an equal number of turns to a given length of thread spun out. We find this difficulty increasing of late years, and have come to the conclusion that if some of the spinners do not keep better time on their spinning wheels, we should have dreadfully to listen to their music.

At every moment of labor should be employed to the best advantage, and every ounce of material be appropriated to the best purpose, on account of our war, we propose to write some other chapters on our branch of business after this is read sufficiently to be remembered, and shall endeavor to do our best.

The Secretary of the Treasury gives notice that subscriptions will be received for Coup in Treasury notes payable three years from Aug. 15th, 1865 with semi-annual interest at the rate of seven and three tenths per cent per annum—principal and interest to be paid in lawful money on the 15th of each month.
