THE LAW OF NEWSPAPERS, — 1. Subscribers who do not give express notice to the contrary are considered as wishing to continue their subscription. 2. Any person who takes a paper from the Post Office—whether directed to his name or to anotheror whether he has subscribed or not, is responsible for the pay.

3. If a person orders his paper discontinuel, he must now all arreagages, or the publishear man.

3. If a person orders his paper discontinuel, he must pay all arrearages, or the publishear may continue to send it until payment is made, and collect the whole amount, whether it be taken frow the officer not! There can be no legal discodtinuance unsure the made. til the payment is made.

4. It the subscriber orders his paper to be stopped at a certain time, and the publisher continues to send, the subscriber is bound to pay for it, if he takes it out of the office. The law proceeds on the ground that a man must pay for what he uses

5. If subscribers remove to other places Without informing the publisher, and the newspapers are sent to their former direction, they are responsible.

6. The Courts have decided that refusing to take a paper or periodical from the office, or removing and leaving it uncalled for while in arrears to the publish er, is evidence of intentional fraud.

ter who neglects to perform his duty of giving notice as required by the regulations of the Post-office Department, of the neglect of a person to take from the office newspapers addressed to him, renders the Post Master liable to the publisher for the subscription.

Stopping Papers.—Should you desire the publisher of a newspaper to discontinue sending his paper to you, always be positive that he is paid for it up to the date of your request. Remember, if you neglect this duty, it is at his option to do so or not; and if he may prefer to continue sending it, he can hold you responsible for it until all arrearages are aid.
