Rules and Regulations.

Tickets for each admission, twenty-five cents, children under twelve years of age, ten cents. Carriages will be allowed to enter the enclosure on paymeat of fity cents for each admission for a pair of horses, and twenty-five cents for a single horse --Colts, two years and under, ten cents. Stock and all other articles entered for exhibition, free of charge ; horses, mules and colts only excepted. No person will be allowed to gamble or sell intoxicating liquors on the Fair Ground, Tickets of admission will be furnished at the ticket office, near the Fair Ground, and returned to the gate-keeper on entering the enclosure. The Books of entries will be with menry P. Hallstead, Nicholson, Pa., until the day of the Fair, at which time they will be found at the office formerly occupied by Shultz, Eaton & Co., near the Fair Ground.

All articles and animals intended for exhibition should be entered as early as possible Animals and articles entered for exhibition will have cards attached with number and class as .ntered on entry book ; and it is required that exhibitors in all cases shall obtain their cards of number and class previous to placing their articles on the grounds.

The books of entries will be closed at nine o'clock. s. m., the second day of the Fair ; except for horses trotting for the \$100 and \$200. They will have the privilege of entering until ten o'clock the third day of the Fair, after which time there will positively be so entries made.

All animals and articles for exhibition must be on the fair Ground as soon as nine o'clock, Thursday morning, the second day of the Fair, at which time the Judges will take the entry books and proceed to decide the merits of the articles and animals entered for premiums. All articles and animals entered for premiums must remain on the Fair Grounds until the close of the Fair Their will be a man on the ground to furnish grain, hay, and straw, to any persons wishing the same

Horsemanship and trotting will be conducted as follows : The three and four years old colts will trot the first day of the Fair, commencing at two o'clock p. m. Sweepstakes premium of \$30, for all horses that never trotted in public within three minutes at two o'clock, p. m., see nd day. The double team tiot for \$100 premium, and the single \$300 premium will be trotted for on the third day, commencing with the double team. trot at 12 o'clock, m. Imme diately after it is decided the trot for single horses will come off.

The Annual Address will be delivered from the Judges' stand, at 10; oclock, a. m., on the third day of the Fair

Immediat ily after the address, the Reports of the Judges will be announced

The premiums will be paid at the office of the Treasurer, in Glenwood, on and after the 1st of October, except in classes 20, and 21, which will be

paid on the last day of the Fair, after decision of the Judges.
