disturb the peace at such election or shall use or practice any intimidation, the eats, force or violence, with design to influence unduly or overawe any elector to prevent him from voting or to restrain the freedom of choice, such person or conviction shall be fined in any sum not exceding five hundred dollars and be imprisoned for any time not less than one nor more than twelve months; and if it shall be shown to the Court where the trial of such offence shall be had that the person so offending was not a resident of the city, ward, district or township where the offence was committed and not entitled to a vote fence was committed and not entitled to a vote therein, then, on conviction he shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than one hundred dollars and be imprisoned not less six months nor more than two

years.

Agreeable to the provisions of the sixty-first see tion of said Act, every general and special election shall be opened between the hours of eight and ten in the forenoon and shall continue without interrup-tion or adjournment until seven o'clock in the even

tion or adjournment until seven o'clock in the evening, when the polls shall be closed.


