MRS. SMITH SAYS THEY ARE TRUE AS PUBLISHED.

Denounces the Doctor for Giving Them... Publicity, and Says the Reverend Gen... Herndon Must Have Been Crazy—She... Denies the Statement That She Was... Engaged to Him.

BALTIMORE, May 29.—With regard to... the love letters of the late Rev. Henry... Greenfield Schorr, assistant rector of St. Paul's... P. E. church, published in the... New York World, Mrs. Margaret M. Smith, the... object of the suicide's affections, was... interviewed at her residence. The lady said: "I think Mr. Schorr's act... in sending the letters to The World was... that of a cowardly man. He did it out... of revenge because I would not marry him."

"Were the letters as published true?"... asked the reporter. "Yes, they were," she replied. "I... really did care for him, but told him I... could not marry him. I was a woman... much older than Mr. Schorr—in fact, he... was a boy to me. I think he was crazy... in sending my letters to The World."

Mrs. Smith denies the last paragraph... in Schorr's letter to The World, which... was in effect that they were engaged, and... that she had also been engaged to the... Rev. Mr. Pond of Philadelphia. Mrs. Smith... is a rich widow of 49 years; Mr. Schorr... was 29 years old.

The remains of the young minister... were buried in the Baltimore cemetery... on Tuesday. Rev. Dr. Hodges, rector of... St. Paul's, officiated at the house and... Bishop Fayet at the grave.

DEFYING THE EAGLE.

Canadian Whalers Getting Ready to In... vade Behring Sea.

OTTAWA, Ont., May 29.—The govern... ment here has been advised that a large... number of Canadian sealers which for... some time past have been drifting out at... Victoria, B. C., will leave in a few days... for Behring sea. A number of Nova... Scotia sealers, encouraged by the success... of the Pacific coast vessels last season in... avoiding capture by United States revenue... cutters, are bringing their vessels... around Cape Horn with a view to capturing... fat seals within the limit of the... preserve claimed by the Americans. A... prominent government official in speaking... to a reporter said that there was... little doubt that Canadian sealers... would make efforts to hunt in Behring... sea despite the president's proclamation... and the presence of American war vessels.

The British men-of-war he said... would not make any move forward... pending the departure of these vessels, as... by so doing they would in a measure be... recognizing the claims of the Americans... to exclusive sovereignty in the... disputed waters. On the other hand if any... Canadian sealers are taken by American... war ships the British vessels would not... try to recapture, as that would be the... signal for open hostilities. The presence... of the British war vessels will... simply be to see that no outrages are... committed and to show that Great Britain... has not given to the contention of the... United States.

VIOLENT GALES.

Most Damage Done to Vessels in Canadian... Waters.

KINGSTON, Ont., May 29.—A violent... south-westerly gale set in about midnight... and is still blowing, but has moderated... somewhat and veered to the westward. The... steamer Tecumseh left Collins bay with... the barges Cameron, Wotts and Cavalier... for the Welland canal. They had... discharged at Collins bay and were... going back to Lakes Superior for more. The... trip was uneventful until 3 o'clock, when... a stiff gale began to drive them. The... vessel kept getting greater. The captain... of the Tecumseh, when he... got opposite Oak Orchard that to... proceed would be perilous. He rigfited his... boats and let two of them go and one he... kept under line. The boats reached here... this afternoon. The captain reports that... when he reached the main docks he saw... the steamer D. D. Calvin and tow laden... with timber. They seemed to be in... trouble. The barges were away from the... steamer and no sailors seemed to be... in charge. The barges seemed damaged... and an empty yawl was on one of them. The... steamer Nelson, from Toledo, put... in here to-day. She had lost some... canvas and was leaking badly. The... Norway, one of the Calvin's tow, reached... Garden Island last night under sail. She... reports her consort weathering the gale... well.

PRESBYTERIAN PROHIBITION.

Dr. Crosby Offers a Resolution Which the... Assembly Approves.

NEW YORK, May 29.—At the opening... of the Presbyterian general assembly... Rev. Dr. Crosby said he was sorry to see... the protest he made against the temperance... resolution recorded. His object in... opposing the adoption of the sentiment... was to prevent the church being dragged... into the political arena. He offered a... resolution setting forth that the action... taken on the temperance question must... not be construed as the endorsement of... any political party. This was unanimously... adopted.

The report of the special committee on... education was then taken up. After a... long debate it was decided to appoint a... joint committee, with instructions to... report at the next assembly whether it was... advisable to adopt any methods of introducing... ministers into the church other... than those now in vogue. Rev. Dr. S. J. Nicol... was appointed chairman of the committee.

Dr. Crosby then got a motion adopted... explanatory of the vote on the prohibition... question which was taken. This motion... was to the effect that while the vote... favored prohibition it was not to be... looked upon as expressing any political... sentiment whatever.

The case of Rev. Dr. West against the... synod of Minnesota was postponed for a... year after a rather warm colloquy between... Dr. West and Dr. Dickey.

A motion approving the bill setting... apart for educational purposes the money... obtained from the sale of Creek and... Seminole lands was voted down.

The moderator announced Dr. Crosby, Hamlin, Dickey, Wade, Foster and Allison... as the committee to visit President Harrison... on the African slavery question.

Various reports and addresses on... subordinate topics were listened to.

Rev. C. C. Hall of Brooklyn, chairman... of the committee on narratives read a... long account of some aspects of the work... of the church during the year. The session... closed with song and a prayer by Dr. Crosby.

At the evening session a number of... reports of committees were rushed through... and adopted.

Col. E. F. Shepard and Rev. Dr. Thurber... of New York were chosen delegates at... large to the international Presbyterian... conference at Paris in September.

After adopting various resolutions of... thanks the assembly adjourned to meet... at Saratoga in May, 1890.
