

"The specimen of apple twig sent by you is infested with the eggs of the Apple Aphis. I discussed this subject with some care at the recent meeting of the State Horticultural

in the orchard.

I am of the opinion that spraying while the bads remain perfectly dormant may not kill them. There is no reason why one should not incre the strengen of the spray liquid to the specific gravity of 1.04 for the eggs of the Apple Aphis. If they are not killed by the dormant spray they cause the leaves to curl and stunt the growth of leaves, twig and fruit, and cause considerable damage, unless after you will spray them with a strong tobacco decotine. This is the best material to use after the leaves have expanded, but it really should not be necessary to use it, as the strong lime-sulfur solution applied iately the reafter, also destroys many other species of insects, as well as Mites causing the Blister Mite trouble of leaf and truit of apple and pear, and also disease germs of various kinds,
