LESSON FOR JANUARY 4

JESUS AND THE CHILDREN.

LESSON TEXT-Mark 9:30-41; 10:13-16. GOLDEN TEXT-"Gird yourselves with untility, to serve one another; for God esistent the proud, but giveth grace to ne humble."—I Pet. 6:5.

We now return to the New Testament, and during this year finish those studies on the life of Christ which were followed during the year 1912. Almost as though it were an answer to the question, "who are for him. I who are against him?" that was asked in the last lesson for that year, we have presented for our study today, the relations of Jesus with children. Jesus then presented to them a concrete example of what is to be required of all of those who shall seek to enter into this new kingdom. That was a more pertinent question than the one they had just been discussing. (Luke 18:15-17) tells us that these disciples desired to send the children away, hence the words, Suffer them to come." Ever after, when this mean, low, ambition to be "the greatest" came up, there must have arisen before them, in memory, this picture. His appeal to children meets a well nigh universal response in the hearts of men. The fact that the child was so near at hand is suggestive of the attractiveness of Jesus. The disciples were seemingly afraid of him (v. 32), not so, however, the child.
